The North Thoresby Community Events Association

Autumn is usually a very busy period for 'Events' and this year is no exception. One of our most popular events is the **Horticultural Show**, which was revived in 2018, many years after it had disappeared from the village calendar, by the endeavour, imagination and organising skills of Claire Cooper, Sue Sanchez and their band of helpers. Year-on-year this has grown, with ever-more entries and is an outstanding fundraiser for the Community Fund.

In September and early October, we held two **amazing concerts** in quick succession – 'Sage and the Others' (Sept 10th) and The Genie Lamps' (October 1st). Both wowed the audience with their virtuosity and play sets.

Early September saw the publication of another booklet by the History Group, 'North Thoresby in Old Photographs and Postcards' and at the History Group meeting on September 8th, Elizabeth Kershaw and Ian Wright undertook a guided tour through the village's past, projecting the images on screen.

Community Choir The first week in October saw the first meeting of the new Community Choir, with Events putting the pieces of the jigsaw together to make this happen – linking a villager who first raised the idea, with the choirmaster Graham Burrell, then purchasing the appropriate music permissions and finally designing music booklets and getting them printed. All funded by Events. A wonderful turnout has resulted with well over 30 members attending. Public performances are planned over Christmas. A brilliant addition to the village's groups and associations.

Early in October, members of the **History Group** made a breakthrough in discovering **tangible evidence of medieval buildings** in the field to the north of St Helens and this has led to very promising prospects of archaeological investigations in the village during 2023. More detail; later.

North Thoresby's Thriving Community Groups On September 28th, representatives of virtually all of the community groups met in the Wesley Centre, and outlined their activities. This was primarily an occasion for the groups to meet and talk with each other, but we hope it will lead to an occasion when villagers can come and hear what the groups have to offer. One of the main roles of the Community News and Village Directory is to ensure that the programmes and activities of the community groups, who play such a crucial role in the village, are easily, and regularly accessible, in a handy booklet, to all in the parish.

North Thoresby Community Events: Supporting Community Groups and Village Amenities

In early autumn, 'Events' has been active in **supporting community groups** and adding to community amenities. A £250 grant has been pledged to the North Thoresby & Utterby Primary Academies to help fund a Christmas entertainment; £100 to the Parents and Toddlers group to fund new toys and equipment; £150 has been given to help support two Ukrainian refugees to settle in with their village host. Together with the Village People (see article elsewhere in these covers) £600 has been committed to site a bench in memory of Dave Barnett, in the Memorial Garden, which owes its existence to Dave's foresight. Thanks to Tony Shaw, Clerk to the Parish Council for his liaison work. Events have a continuing commitment to fund the equipment of **Robin Kelly** who does such a great job tidying the village streets.

Events until Christmas

Leading up to Christmas, we have another music concert on November 26th with the excellent duo, 'The Mardy Johnny Depps'; an entertaining and educational meeting of the History Group on Thursday 8th December with the East Lindsey Lincolnshire Dialect Society; and a Charity 'Merry Christmas Variety Concert' on Saturday 10th December (in aid of Sunflowers Action Group for Children and Action for Children). As we have done for the last 4 years, Events will string Christmas lights around the Square and will coordinate and collaborate with many community organisations in a Community Carol Service in the Methodist Chapel on Sunday 4th December.





North Thoresby Embroidery Group was established 32 years ago, we meet in the Wesley Centre 6 times a year, three Saturdays in the Spring - January, February ,and March and 3 Saturdays in the Autumn -September, October and November. Our tutor is Sheila Greenhalgh from Cleethorpes.

We have an average of 12 ladies at each meeting and we all work on different mediums of embroidery - goldwork, blackwork, stump work, beading. Some will produce a picture, for example, of their garden or from a postcard, and print it onto fabric adding stitches in various places. Some of our ladies enter their work in village Shows and there are several stitching exhibitions to see around the country each year.

We all look forward to our embroidery days exchanging ideas and techniques. We are a very happy group of ladies and would give any new embroiderer a warm welcome. Both these games ended up in defeats due to key players missing due to holidays and end of season cricket commitments.

Discovery of Medieval Foundations in the Village

It has long been suspected that the field directly to the north of St Helens contains remains of buildings of historical significance – possibly the site of a Manor House, which would have typically been located near the Church and Tithe Barn. The existence, to this day, of two ponds, formerly fish ponds, in the field, add weight to the theory. There is also an ancient 'bluestone' in the field, which traditionally has been believed to be where the manor court was held – the steward, jurymen and tenants of the Manor, marching in procession through the village to the stone in 'Boundels Croft' (corrupted today to Bond Croft), each bearing a white hazel wand.

Our hopes of discovering evidence has been helped by the development of Lidar technology (sometimes spelt Ladar), whereby a location can be targeted with a laser from above and the time it takes for the reflected light to return to the receiver is measured. High resolution maps are then produced. Lidar maps of the field show interesting 'lumps and bumps'.

However, our breakthrough has come with an entirely different approach – using the abilities of a remarkable local 'Dowser' - dowsing being a process by which a Y-shaped twig or rod is used to 'divine' water, or buried metals, gravestones etc. Scientific evidence suggests that dowsing is no more effective than random chance but that wasn't our experience one Saturday in early October. The Dowser immediately identified stone foundations some 50cm underground – and a little digging soon revealed laid chalk foundations and stone post-stones indicating a doorway. We are now awaiting full and appropriate permissions to investigate further, with expert assistance from the County Archaeologists.


Kelter: Noun, rubbish. Verb, to throwaway as rubbish. 'Chuck that kelter on the fire.' And 'she keltered him into the sea.'

Retiring Chair

After 6 years as chairman of the 1940s Event and its successor, the North Thoresby Community Events Association, the time has come for me to stand down – every phase of one's life has a limited time span, and I have many commitments and interests which need a little more of my time - and a substantial 'bucket list' to work through.

In September 2016, with Kitty and I newly arrived in the village and innocently attending a committee meeting in the Village Hall, I was unexpectedly faced with a choice – to allow the 1940s Event to fold, or take it on. Quickly conferring with Kitty, we decided to go for it – what better way to integrate ourselves in the community? While there were many challenges ahead, we've never regretted that decision and it's never been a chore – in fact, it's brought us into contact with so many wonderful people and greatly contributed to the marvellous quality of life we enjoy here.

We have been very lucky indeed to assemble a dedicated, skilled and imaginative committee with Dave Bedlow, Claire Cooper, Sarah Middleton, Zoe Snell, Sue and John Sanchez, and Mark Wilson all serving for all, or virtually all, of my time here and others, including current members George Krawiec and John Norman have made very valuable contributions. Anything, and everything, we have achieved has been a team effort. It's also been a joy to get to know and work with all the community groups in the village - many of great longstanding. The village is, without doubt, a special place.

Of course, Kitty and I will continue to be involved in many of the activities and social groups here, and, along with a number of friends and colleagues, I have a pretty big agenda with the History Group, Archive Centre, production of a second volume of the village history and potential archaeological investigations in the village.

In many ways, community activists are swimming against the tide of modern life but it's ever more important in a world increasingly in turmoil, that at the smallest level of social life, community groups provide spaces and opportunities for individuals to come together, to build friendships and bonds of solidarity. In this respect, along with the other community groups, I hope we have made a positive difference here.
